## 2010 OUTDOOR SOCCER WIND-UP TOURNAMENT

The Wind-up Tournament is scheduled for Saturday June 19 and Sunday June 20. The tournament headquarters will be found at the Glencairn Recreation Centre, located on 2626 Dewdney Avenue East. A concession stand will be located at the Glencairn Recreation Centre.

1. Teams can report to the tournament headquarters following any game to pickup your refreshment tickets.
2. All games will start at the scheduled time. If a game starts late, time will be taken off the playing time.
3. Game rules will be the same as during the regular season. The timing for all age groups will be a 5 minute warm-up followed by two 22 ½ minute halves with a five minute half time. The remaining 5 minutes will be used for game transition.
4. The full field boundaries and creases will be marked. The Coaches are asked to use their cones to mark the mini fields. Please use the corner flags to mark the corners and sidelines to assist the referees.
5. Tied Games
  - a. Under 6 and Under 8 games will stand.
  - b. Under 10, Under 12, Under 14 and Under 18 round-robin games will use the following Point System:
    - i. Win = 6 points
    - ii. Loss = 0 points
    - iii. Tie = 3 points
    - iv. Shutout = 1 point
    - v. Bonus – 1 point per goal to a maximum of 3 points (total maximum points are 10).
  - c. If teams are tied after the round-robin, the tie will be broken by:
    - i. The difference in the goals for and against.
    - ii. The flip of a coin.
6. The winning team must report the game result to the tournament headquarters. The schedule will be updated at that time. Schedules for Sunday games will be posted at the Glencairn Recreation Center and on the REZYSA website by 7:00 PM on Saturday. The schedule can also be obtained by calling the Tournament phone number after 6:00 PM Saturday.

8. Please have your entire team report to the tournament headquarters following your final game for the trophy presentation.
9. If you have any questions during the tournament, please see a REZYSA Executive at the tournament headquarters.
10. If weather forces a game to be called with the half or more completed, the score at that time will become the final score. If weather forces a game to be cancelled prior to the game beginning or before half-time is reached, the game will be decided by a shoot-out. In all instances the referee and/or Executive will make this decision. Any failure to follow the ruling will cause the team(s) to be disqualified from the Tournament.
  - a. Shoot-out Procedure
    - i. Kicks will be taken from a spot located 6 m directly in front of the goal for Under 10, and 10 m directly in front of the goal for the older age groups.
    - ii. The keeper must have both feet on the goal line until the ball is kicked.
    - iii. The shooter may take a running kick.
    - iv. The keeper may be any player on the team roster.
    - v. Each team will select any 5 players from the team roster, initially, and the teams will alternate the shots. If the score is still tied, each team will take alternating shots until the tie is broken after even shots.
    - vi. No player may be used more than once during the shoot-out unless all other players, including the keeper, have taken their turn.
11. Team rosters will be on hand at the Tournament Headquarters. If a team is found with non-registered players, the team will be disqualified from the Tournament.

## **Teams are to return their equipment to the Tournament Headquarters after the final game.**

## **DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURE**

The Disciplinary Procedure that has been developed for the outdoor season will be used throughout the wind-up tournament. This is to protect the players, spectators, coaches and referees.

The Disciplinary Committee will focus on any infraction(s) when the referee has issued a red card.

With every red card infraction, the referee and the offender are to submit a written statement on the events that took place and the statements are to be handed into the Committee.

**All referees should address the coach with any cardable infraction that involves the spectators or the players. They are also expected to state what infraction took place.**
